The term 'all of a sudden' is one that is used all too often when describing a collision, by planning ahead and anticipating other road users movements, we can work together to make Glasgow's roads safer.

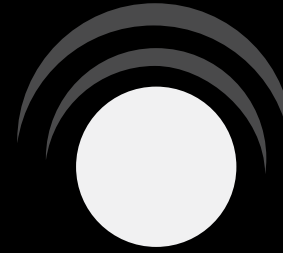

Crossing facilities such as **pelicans and zebras** are the **safest place to cross**, if you can't find one on or near your route, look out for traffic islands instead.

- **Be prepared for your journey -**
if you normally take medication, ensure you have taken the correct dosage. If you wear glasses ensure that you have them with you and are wearing them. If you use a hearing aid make sure it is in working order before setting off on a journey.
- **Start by checking that the road is clear -**
if using a crossing facility - wait for the traffic to stop, even if the green man is showing.
- **If there is not a crossing facility anywhere near -**
find a safe place to cross where you feel comfortable - avoid crossing where you can't be seen, for example between parked cars or near junctions and bends.
- **If you have to cross at the front of a stationary bus or lorry -**
keep a good distance between yourself and the vehicle about 3m/10 feet. Look up at the driver and establish eye contact.
- **Be Safe Be Seen -**
wear light/bright clothing - drivers must be able to see you.

Make the effort, find the crossing, Push The Button and **WAIT** - that's what motorists expect you to do.
